- **Jewish Family Service:**
Our goal is to promote, strengthen, and preserve individual, family, and community well-being in a manner consistent with Jewish philosophy and values.
- **Columbia Holocaust Education Commission:**
Dedicated to promoting awareness of the Columbia Holocaust Memorial Monument and fostering Holocaust education throughout South Carolina.

The Katie and Irwin Kahn Jewish Community Center:

The Katie and Irwin Kahn Jewish Community Center meets Jewish communal needs through programming and wellness, creating a place of comfort and belonging while furthering our mission through partnership with local Jewish organizations.

Columbia Jewish Day School:

The Columbia Jewish Day School has been awarded national accreditation and provides a nurturing environment where each child receives the highest quality Jewish and general academic education.

B'nai Brith Youth Organization:

BBYO is the Columbia Jewish community's leading pluralistic teen movement, aspiring to involve more Jewish teens in more meaningful Jewish experiences. For more than 80 years, BBYO has provided exceptional identity enrichment and leadership development experiences for hundreds of thousands of Jewish teens. Jewish Educational Loan Fund:

JELF partners with Jewish students in a 5-state region (GA, NC, SC, VA, FL) to fulfill their potential by providing last dollar, interest-free loans for post secondary education.

Hillel:

Hillel at USC provides Jewish learning and experiences as well as the opportunities to build life-long friendships. Students who participate in Hillel take part in dinners, cookouts, get-togethers, Shabbat dinners, movies, holiday events, lectures, kayaking trips, camping trips, meetings with other ethnic and religious organizations, and more.

Community Grants:

The Columbia Jewish Federation supports community grants every year that fund a variety of local educational events. Continuation of these grants is dependent on your contribution.
